# Michigan Medicare & Medicaid Eligible


- Roughly 240,000 Michiganders have eligibility for both Medicare and Medicaid.
- 60% are over the age of 65
- 40% are under the age of 65
- Beneficiaries with dual eligibility have greater health and long term support services needs.



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### What is MI Health Link?

MI Health Link has a goal to combine Medicare and Medicaid into a single health care system for people who are on both programs.



### **MI Health Link**

#### Will start in

- Eight Counties in Southwest Michigan (Barry, Berrien, Branch, Calhoun, Cass, Kalamazoo, St. Joseph, Van Buren Counties) and
- All of the Upper Peninsula

#### Then 3 to 4 months later in

- Wayne County
- Macomb County

### **MI** Health Link

- Your Doctors, Specialists, Hospitals, Equipment, and Medications
- Long Term Supports and Services nursing homes and home care.

### **MI** Health Link

- If you have both Medicare and Medicaid you can sign-up and pick a MI Health Link plan or you will later be assigned a MI Health Link plan.
- You can "opt-out" or change plans monthly.
- Some people cannot sign-up at all if you:
  - are on Medicaid spend-down,
  - or you don't have both Medicare and Medicaid
- Some people can choose to sign-up but won't be assigned
  - MI Choice Home and Community Based Waiver
  - PACE
  - Have insurance through an employer retirement
  - Native Americans

# MI Health Link Plan Will Cover and Provide Services

MI Health Link Health Plans will arrange for the following health care services:

- Primary Care; i.e. regular doctors visits, follow up appointments
- Acute Care; i.e. treatment for an accident or trauma
- Long Term Supports and Services; i.e. assistance with preparing meals, bathing, and dressing

Prepaid Inpatient Health Plans (PIHPs) will provide:

 Behavioral Health/Mental and Developmental Disabilities services and supports

### How Do I Make a Choice

May want a trusted person to help you.





Will need to figure out what plans your doctors, specialists, druggists, hospitals, equipment place are with.

If you currently have home care or other long-term support services.





- There may be no co-pays or deductibles with MI Health Link
- A care coordinator may help cut through bureaucracy, overcome barriers, and resolve problems
- Person-centered services starting with what the person wants
- May have improved access to some services (home care, equipment)
- More opportunities to shape health care practice and some rules
