Dear President-Elect Obama,

As you no doubt heard directly from voters during the election season, families across New Jersey are increasingly anxious about health care and are eager to see the new Administration and Congress keep their pledge to enact reforms that will ensure that everyone in America has access to affordable and stable health insurance coverage and high-quality health care.

With rising premiums far out-pacing wages, everyone is feeling the effects. Family premiums for health coverage have increased 30 percent since 2001, while income has increased just three percent. Polling data collected prior to the election asked likely voters to rank policy ideas based on how effective they would be at improving the current economic situation, and the top two answers were reducing health care costs and providing health care to all Americans.

As we move into a new presidential administration and Congress, our leaders must work together to find common-ground policies to provide coverage to all Americans.

We therefore urge Congress and President-elect Obama to make comprehensive health reform the top domestic priority and the one that is tackled first. New Jersey's children, businesses, seniors, people with disabilities and families are counting on action and his leadership.
